Psalm 8 principles:

• Physical Environment: In verses 6-8 we saw that we are responsible for caring for our planet.

- Our Personal Lives: In verse 2 we see how we are to take care of ourselves.
- Our Relationships: In verse 4 we see that loving others and learning from others with our heads and heart is essential for building healthy relationships.
- Our Community: In verse 4 we realize that <u>we were made to grow in community</u> and <u>we were made to go into our community</u>.

- 1. Jesus created a spiritual community for you to join in order to grow.
 - a. We grow in our faith best in small communities of faith.
 - b. People new to faith are like spiritual children and need a safe and challenging place to grow.
 - c. Why I go to church nearly every weekend:
 - i. God sets the agenda for my encounter with His Truth.
 - ii. God sets the agenda for my serving others.
 - d. The "Christian Walk" is not a self-directed, isolated affair.
- 2. Jesus created a spiritual family in order for you to learn and practice love, learn and practice forgiveness, and learn and live Biblical Truth.
- 3. Jesus created a spiritual family for you in order for you to discover your mission/purpose in life.
 - a. You are here for a reason, you are not a mistake.
 - b. Being in a group is where you discover and sharpen your spiritual gifts as you put them into practice.
 - c. All people need to move to a more mature stage of faith by practicing their spiritual gifts.
 - d. Maturity is discovering God's purpose for the world, and how you fit into His purpose personally.
 - i. You cannot find your personal purpose apart from His purpose for His church.
 - ii. When we ask and examine this question, this is when you grow the most in your faith.
 - iii. If you are in a small group, or leading small group, you can never forget that your community of faith has been given a mission by Jesus. We are all on a mission.
 - e. It is the mission of Jesus that keeps your small group healthy, vibrant, and moving forward in the love of Christ.
 - i. Who is your group praying for?
 - ii. Who is your group trying to include?
 - iii. What has your group done in order to bless the community around you?
